

Restorative justice is all about building a system focused on reconciliation and rehabilitation. In this TEDx video, college sophomore Laila Fakhoury explains the power of restorative justice to repair and prevent the harms caused by the school-to-prison pipeline.

Rachel says: One goal of TAP is to cut through the <u>school-to-prison pipeline</u>, a national trend in which children are funneled out of public schools and into the juvenile and criminal justice systems. TAP, peer mediation, and conflict resolution are part of a much larger framework within **restorative justice**.
