STRATEGY OF THE MONTH

NON-STANDARD MEDIATIONS

The TAP mediation process you learned in training is highly structured, but often mediators encounter peers who need help resolving their conflicts in the hallway, at a team practice, at home, or other times when scheduling a mediation might not be the easiest option.

In this case, you can do a **non-standard mediation**: a time when a casual
conversation using your conflict resolution
skills can help your peers.
Starting in the fall, you will be able to log
these mediations just like the standard
mediations you're used to.
